



Pastor's Letter

Ecclesiastes 3: 1-11 A Time for Everything

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance, a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing, a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away, a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak, a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace. What do workers gain from their toil? I have seen the burden God has laid on the human race. He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the human heart; yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end.

The author of Ecclesiastes is often described as being a bit pessimistic, a bit of an older curmudgeon-like figure who has about had it with life. Through the book, he paints a very dim



reality of the world as tainted with sin and filled with injustice. Yet Ecclesiastes concludes with a new voice of optimism and reframe-one that says, "trust God and know that the Lord is good even when life is difficult." The book does not end on a down note, but rather we find hope even in times of darkness and uncertainty. The text is often cited at funerals as an invitation to dwell-to think about seasons of life. All of that said, perhaps, this, chapter three, is the most famous portion of the text, and it too is filled with a sort of dark, yet profound truth.

There is a time for everything under the sun...now the thing is, there isn't just sadness in the text, but also an invitation to rejoice in the good, to reflect on the times of building, laughter, dancing, gathering, embracing, and the list goes on. At the heart of the text, we find a simple offer inviting us to acknowledge the seasonality of life, and the fact that God is good through all of them.

Now comes a, perhaps, sad word of my own. After prayerful consideration and meditation with Becca and several mentors, I have come to the conclusion that September 1st will be my last Sunday as pastor at Colonial Beach Baptist Church. As this season closes another begins in our family's life, as we will be moving to Lowesville, VA, where I will be transitioning to become the next Operations and Pastoral Director at Crossroads Camp and Conference Center, run by the WMUV. This was not an easy decision, and it's one that, like the excerpt from Ecclesiastes, is both exciting and saddening.

As I look back over these past four and a half years and think about my time as pastor at CBBC, I cannot help but think wow, what an awesome group of people, what an incredible, formative experience. I cannot help but reflect from my first Sunday, as COVID hit, and preaching from our apartment living room through Facebook Live, and all of the weaves and



calling us to something new, and I am excited for the future, yet my heart hurts as I think about saying goodbye...so I won't, instead I will say, see you later. Don't be surprised if Becca, Leo, and I drop in randomly from time to time! You all will remain in my thoughts and prayers & likewise I ask that you might continue to hold my family and I in yours. But now, mirroring the heart of Paul, let me use his words and end with this:

1 Corinthians 1: 4

"I always thank my God for you because of his grace given you in Christ Jesus. For in him you have been enriched in every way—with all kinds of speech and with all knowledge— God thus confirming our testimony about Christ among you.

Therefore, you do not lack any spiritual gift as you eagerly wait for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed. He will also keep you firm to the end, so that you will be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ., God is faithful, who has called you into fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord."
